EMERGENCY CONTACTS

POLICE OR FIRE BRIGADE: DIAL 000—If ineffective Dial 1100 (exchange)

Organisation	Location	Telephone	Ask For

HAZARDS

FIRE	Flammable. Heat may cause safety device to operate and release contents but cylinder may rupture before safety device operates.
HEALTH	In Confined spaces and at high concentrations gas may cause dizziness, drowsiness and suffocation. Gas may collect in low lying areas.
OTHER	Container damage from impact, fire or chemical attack may lead to explosive release of contents.

EMERGENCY PROCEDURES

IF THIS HAPPENS ↓	DO THIS ↓
FOR ALL EMERGENCIES	Shut off engine and electrical equipment. No smoking or naked lights within 50 metres. Move people from immediate area; keep upwind Send messenger to notify fire brigade and police telling them location, material, quantity, UN Number and emergency contact as well as condition of vehicle and damage observed.
TANKER/VEHICLE ACCIDENT	Carry out action under FOR ALL EMERGENCIES. Check for spills or leaks. Do not move vehicle if movement could cause spillage or generate sparks. Warn other traffic.
